53rd REUNION DAY (OBA) – 18 Jun 2022

EVENT REPORT

1. The 53rd OBA reunion was held on 18 June 2022. The activities associated with the reunion are recorded in the succeeding paragraphs:

PROGRAMME ON REUNION DAY - 18 June 2022

0700h – Arrival of Alumni

2. Alumni started arriving on the Campus as early as 0700h. A total of 317 alumni registered their names at the counter, of whom 204 paid the registration fee as batches passing out after 2015 were exempted from paying the fees. INR 1,02,000 was collected as registration fees.

0800h – Unfurling of OBA Flag and Homage at the Hut of Remembrance

3. The SSKZM OBA President Cdr Sam T Samuel (Retd) (637/75) unfurled the OBA Flag exactly at 0800h. Subsequently, he led those who were present and paid homage at the Hut of Remembrance.

4. Thereafter, the Old Boys proceeded to the school foyer.

0815h – Arrival of the Chief Guest and Wreath Laying

5. Col Dhirendra Kumar, Principal SSKZM and Patron SSKZM OBA was the Chief Guest. He was received by the President SSKZM OBA, after which the Chief Guest laid a wreath at the Stupa of Remembrance in memory of the alumni who laid down their lives in the nation's service.

0830h – Floral Tributes to Martyrs

6. The Chief Guest thereafter paid homage to the School's Founder Shri VK Krishna Menon in the foyer, Capt Harshan AC in the South Wing, 2/Lt R M Naresh and Maj GS Satish Chandran SM in the Central Triangle and Col NJ Nair AC KC in the North Wing.

0900h - Commemoration Meeting at Dr APJ Abdul Kalam Memorial Auditorium

7. The commemoration meeting commenced with the School Song sung by Cadets of the School on stage. Cdr Sam T Samuel (Retd), President OBA welcomed all those present and subsequently addressed the audience. He then gave away the OBA sponsored prizes to cadets who excelled in various fields during the year 2021-

22. As the School was closed for most part of the year due to Covid 19, very few activities could be held, and hence the number of prizes awarded were also limited.

8. The OBA President then called the EC Members onto the stage in order to felicitate retired teachers and other employees. A total of 10 retired teachers and staff were felicitated. Shri Mathew K Thomas who won a National Award in Teaching was also felicitated by the OBA.

1100h - Festival Cricket Match between OBA Team and School Team

14. After a delayed start, an exciting Cricket match was played between the OBA Team led by Capt Louis George (Retd) and the School Team. All Old Boys and their families witnessed the match which ended in an exciting last-ball win for the OBA Team.

1200h- AGB Meeting at Dr APJ Abdul Kalam Memorial Auditorium

15. While the Cricket Match was still in progress, the Old Boys proceeded to the Dr APJ Abdul Kalam Memorial Auditorium for the Annual General Body Meeting of the Old Boys Association. Minutes of the same are attached separately.

1230h & 1330h – Lunch

16. Ex Masters, ladies and children proceeded to the shamiana in front of the 2/Lt Radha Mohan Naresh Hall (Cadets' Mess) at 1230h for the Reunion lunch prepared by SSKZM and sponsored by the OBA. The lunch for Cadets of Junior Classes was arranged at the Hall itself. Later, at 1330h, after the General Body meeting, Old Boys joined Cadets of senior classes for lunch at the Hall.

MINUTES OF SSKZM OBA ANNUAL GENERAL BODY MEETING

Dr APJ Abdul Kalam Memorial Auditorium | 18 June 2022

Silent Prayer in Memory of Dear Departed

1. The General Body meeting started with a one-minute silent prayer in memory of Old Boys who left for heavenly abode during the year. 105 alumni attended the AGBM.

Welcome Address and Brief on OBA's contributions by President, SSKZM OBA

2. Cdr Sam T Samuel, the President OBA welcomed the OBA-in-Charge & Ex-Officio Member Shri Arun Kumar MS and all other members to the meeting.

3. Thereafter, the President proceeded to the stage and gave a presentation on the contributions the OBA, various Batches and individuals had made over the last seven years during his leadership.

4. He covered the brief under the following heads:

- (a) Introduction
- (b) Objectives of the OBA
- (c) State of Funds over the Years

5. Introduction The President reminded the members that majority of the current EC took over in 2014 which meant that the team has worked for over seven years. He thanked all members of the EC and others who helped the EC to function over these years and who have contributed financially and otherwise. He felt that he needed to share his experiences and review the progress made over the years. He also mentioned that the strengths and weaknesses of the OBA need to be assessed and work is needed towards making it stronger.

6. Objectives of the OBA He reminded the members to concentrate their combined energy towards the objectives of the OBA:

- (a) To create, foster and maintain union, friendship fellowship among the former students
- (b) To maintain links between the Old Boys and School to perpetuate their interest in Alma Mater
- (c) To provide inspiration and guidance to the students of School, through the experiences and achievements of Old Boys.
- (d) To enlist the interest and support of Old Boys in improvement and development of the School.
- (e) To institute Scholarships and awards to promote any other object of general interest and usefulness.

8. Financial Health. The President drew the Members' attention to the fact that the Fund position has nearly quadrupled over the period from 18 lakhs to 70 lakhs because it was ensured that only interest income and the amount received during Old Boys day is utilised for Expenditures. This has been achieved even though regular payments were made for organising OBA-sponsored events like Late Col NJ Nair, AC, KC Memorial Quiz/Debate, Capt Harshan AC, Memorial Basket Ball Tournament and Late Shri NBN Teachers Enrichment Programme every year. Regular payments have also been made from Students Scholarship Fund as well expenditure for Yearly prizes for Cadets was met out of Endowments. In addition, 30% taxes are being paid regularly, which is a major expenditure from the Interest Income. He mentioned that there was tremendous potential for further increasing the Corpus.

9. Measures Adopted for Functional Transparency, Accountability and Efficiency.

The President listed the various measures adopted towards improving the transparency, accountability and efficiency of the EC. The OBA has been re-registered with the Registrar of Societies. A document named 'Way Forward' was prepared to give a direction to the OBA. Standard Operating Procedures were made in order to standardise the manner in which EC should function. A Communication Cell was formed and WhatsApp groups formed for various Chapters in addition to a group

known as 'Batch Council Group' where one or two representatives from each batch is included. Website was made operational. EC Meetings were conducted regularly and all minutes recorded and communicated to all. It was ensured that Quarterly Financial Statements were passed during EC Meetings.

10. OBA Sponsored Events and Support to Cadets. The President OBA listed out the regular payments out of the OBA Funds as follows:-

(a) Late Col NJ Nair, AC, KC Memorial Quiz/Debate Competition and Late Capt R Harshan Memorial Basketball Tournament – Nearly INR 1 Lakh per year is paid for conduct of these yearly events.

(b) Late Shri N Balakrishnan Nair Memorial Teachers Enrichment Programme – Approximately INR 60,000/- is expended every year.

(c) Prizes to Cadets out of Endowments from various Batches and Individuals – Approx INR 33000 per year.

(d) SSF – Approximately INR 90,000/- per year and increasing every year as the Fund increases. Only 70% from the interest income after deduction of tax out of SSF is utilised to support financially needy cadets. There is a need to increase the Corpus of this fund as there are many cadets who need our support. A suggestion is that the batches celebrating their 25th and 50th anniversary of passing out donate some amount of money to the Corpus of this Fund.

(e) In addition, there is the expenditure on making plaques and citations for winners of OBA awards and also miscellaneous expenditures like payment for Accounts Clerk, Web hosting charges, rent for office etc.

11. Contributions from Organising Batches. The President mentioned the contributions of various Organising Batches during the tenure of the EC under his leadership.

The President highlighted the contributions of the journalists community of OBs who always came forward to help the school in giving wide publicity to its problems and achievements.

13. Financial Support to Employees and Old Boys The President OBA thanked the Old Boys for supporting the employees of the School and other Old Boys

in their hours of need whenever he sent out an appeal to the community and sometimes on their own initiative. He listed the contributions as under:

14. Conduct of Golden Jubilee The Golden Jubilee of the OBA held on 12 and 13 July 2019 was conducted on an unprecedented scale due to the cooperation and dedicated work of the EC and many Old Boys. He listed the activities during Golden Jubilee:

- (a) A total of 550 OBs and 250 families (excluding children) attended
- (b) The programme for the Golden Jubilee included:
 - (i) Flying display by Sarang team of the IAF
 - (ii) Motor bike display by the Indian
 - (iii) Dog show by Indian
 - (iv) Continuity drill by Indian Airforce
 - (v) Aero modelling display by NDA
 - (vi) Band Display by the Indian Navy
 - (vii) Grand Kazak Meet & Dinner at the Army Officer's Institute

He expressed his special gratitude to Air Marshal B Suresh, PVSM, AVSM, VM, ADC, the AOC in C Southern Air Command and Chairman LBA, who gave us his whole hearted support, the three service headquarters for providing us the excellent shows, the senior old boys who coordinated with the service headquarters, the Brigade Commander Pangode, the school staff who took extra effort to make the event a success and the Old boys at Thrissur, Kottayam, Kochi, Kozhikode and Trivandrum who took the initiative to conduct the Col NJ Nair Memorial Quiz Competition. He described it as one of a kind event which was given wide publicity by the journalist Old Boys.

14. Weaknesses Although he received tremendous support from the Old Boys during his tenure, certain weaknesses that he observed were mentioned. Deliberate thought should be given by the General Body while electing the EC members as the functioning of the EC was affected as some members have not

attended the Executive Committee Meetings at all and majority of the meetings were attended by less than 50 percent of EC members. The second aspect he observed was that a few members were misusing the WhatsApp groups started by the Communication Cell of the EC to express their political and religious views. He emphasised that these groups have been made only for communicating OBA-related matters and all members.

15. Recommendations for the Future Having been in the chair for more than seven years, he had a few recommendations for future Presidents:

(a) He found tremendous potential in tapping CSR Funds for infrastructural needs of the School. It may not be in the long-term interest of OBA to seek contributions from members for infrastructural needs of the school though some such projects are executed by the Organising Batch. Many of the Old Boys are in the senior hierarchy of Public and Private Sector Companies which are required to spend some percentage of their profits on CSR. An effort should be made by influential OBs to get some of these funds for the School.

(b) Linking of Chapters with the OBA is another area which can further strengthen the OBA

(c) OBA is 53 years old and should be in a position to help young Old Boys in the form of Career Guidance and Placement.

(d) Another point which could be examined is to have Chapter Representatives attending the Executive Committee Meetings of OBA

(e) In the recent years, the entry into NDA and NA has diminished. It may be worthwhile to organise a discussion with all stakeholders including, the teachers, parents, Cadets and those Cadets of NDA who have joined recently to try and identify the problem areas and assist the school.

16. Conclusion. The President thanked all Old Boys for giving him an opportunity to serve the OBA and the School and wished OBA all the very best in future.

Presentation by Administrative Officer SSKZM

17. Lt Col Shelley K Das, Administrative Officer SSKZM thanked OBA for all the help rendered to the school especially the 2000 Batch for donating medicines to the MI Room, to Shri Babu Mathew and the team from CARSEL which conducted training programme for the Cadets, Shri Vijayan Nair (578), PJ Joseph (550) and the batch of 1974 for getting much needed money for air conditioning of the library, for audio visual aids, electric scooter and auto rickshaw, the batch of 1977 for sponsoring the 'Innovation' Project, the 1978-79 Batch and 1996 Batch for taking the initiative in completing the construction of house for Yoshua. He requested the Old Boys to continue supporting the School. Towards this, he projected a wish list of the school for financial support from OBA and its members:-

(a) A series of books on history costing about INR 1.5 lakhs

(b) A life size statue of a Cadet at a prominent place - INR 3 lakhs

- (c) A telephone exchange and upgrading of telecom infrastructure - INR 2 lakhs
- (d) An additional floor scrubber for the office – INR 2 lakhs
- (e) High Jump cushion – INR 2.5 lakhs
- (f) Pole Vault cushion – INR 3 lakhs
- (g) High mast lighting (4 Nos) – INR 2 lakhs
- (h) Upgradation of Science Labs – INR 2.5 lakhs
- (j) Maintenance of Science Park – INR 5.75 lakhs
- (k) Electric loader Rikshaw – INR 4 lakhs
- (l) Digitisation of Records – INR 10 lakhs
- (m) Pre fab shelter for new CSD – INR 15 lakhs
- (n) Commercial Dishwasher – INR 15 lakhs
- (o) Afforestation - INR 50 lakhs

Presentation by Shri Rajesh M Nair of 1977 Batch

18. The 1977 Batch has volunteered to create an Innovation Laboratory to stimulate innovative ideas and 'out of the box' thinking in the cadets so that they become confident and find solutions to problems. Shri Rajesh M Nair from the batch who has vast experience in the field and has conducted a number of workshops in schools and universities in USA and India gave a short presentation on the idea along with Brig Sanal Kumar (Retd).

Presentation by the Organising Secretary on the Activities Planned by 1996 Batch

19. Shri Madhu Mohan, the Organising Secretary representing the 1996 Batch gave a brief presentation on their plans to conduct various activities during the year 2022-23 and organising the Old Boys day in 2023.

- (a) The batch has designed a logo for the event and named the Day as 'Fandando '23' with each alphabet in a different colour
- (b) The batch has constituted a committee of 10 in 2020 itself to plan and organise the activities
- (c) The batch has already completed some projects and given financial aid to some people. The details are as follows:-
 - (i) Financial aid to Kazaks and families – INR 13,00,000
 - (ii) Financial aid to General Employees and their families – INR 3,50,500
 - (iii) Sponsored an Astronomy Lab in the school – INR 4 lakhs

- (iv) Carried out a financial awareness training program for the General Employees of the school in two phases
 - (v) Created a plantain garden in the school (Supported by Sri. Iyer, Father of Arun Iyer (2672/96), and planted fruit trees as well
- (d) The batch has recommended two dates, 22 Jul 2023 and 29 Jul 2023 for the next Old Boys Day.

Presentation of Audited Accounts and Budget by Treasurer

20. Shri Santhosh Kumar, Treasurer OBA presented the audited accounts for the year 2021-22 and the Budget for the year 2022-23 and explained various expenditures during the year. The audited Accounts and Budget are attached as Annexure I and II to the minutes. There being no further discussion on the subject, the accounts were proposed to be passed by Capt Louis George (Retd) and seconded by Brig Sanal Kumar (Retd).

Other Points with Permission from the Chair

21. There were no points from the members and hence the General Body proceeded to the next item on the agenda which was election of the office bearers.

Election of Office Bearers for 2022-23

22. As per Bye Laws of SSKZM OBA, all posts in the EC were vacated on 18 June 2022 (OB Day). The two senior-most Old Boys present having declined from presiding over as the returning officer, the third senior most Capt Louis George (642/1972) presided over the election as Returning Officer and supervised the smooth conduct of election of new office bearers for 2022-23. For the President, the name of Col M Sajjad (Retd) (574/1974) was proposed by Dr Rajookrishnan (563/1974) and seconded by Shri CR Sasikumar (551/1974). There being no other contestant for the President, Col M Sajjad (Retd) was elected as President.
