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Progressive Education Society School, Kuzhamburam was established on 20 Jan 1952 in the military barracks at Puzhathi, Thiruvananthapuram. The Chief Minister of Kerala, Late P. Ramamanna Pillai chose the location for the school 30 km away from Thiruvananthapuram on NH 47 near Kuzhamburam. The growing concern of the Government to provide the requisite standards of the Western (Class) and the Eastern (Vidya) situated on a hillside benefited with agreement to an ideal location for a military based residential institution. The foundation stone of Sanku School, Kuzhamburam was laid by Late V.V. Krishna Menon, Minister of Defence, Govt of India on 25 Feb. 1952. The founder Principal was Lt Col HC Jankar, Commandant Iyer (Lt) (Retd) and the Inspector was Lt Col YS. Nair. During the 50 years of its existence, the school has been providing quality education as a feeder institution to IAS, IAF and IMA and also making public school education accessible to the common man.

Infrastructure facilities: Academic block with 30 classrooms having smart e-learning facilities, well furnished staff mess, Multimedia auditor hall, a well laid out recreation area, Art and Craft workshop, Library with three reading rooms and Administrative block within the main building. Cafeteria mess with canteen making appetizing, healthy, Hygienic and sumptuous food. Multi purpose Auditorium with a seating capacity of 500. Music room, Lab, Computer lab, English grounds for all our four games. Tennis court with Volleyball, Netball courts. 1000 covered, 1000 open, Clubbing area, 5000 acres, Music room, Dance and Gymnasium. Sports will include Aerobics with study halls with a capacity to accommodate approximately 50 cadets in each dormitory. 500 Bunk with 50 beds and no maintenance work.

Academic facilities: Teachers with impeccable qualifications, years of experience, skilled in various games and other co-curricular activities benefit the cadets. The school also has the necessary support of following excellent performance in CBSE Board Examinations. The school has achieved 100% results in the I Term 2018 and Class 8 student number in the former grade. The school has won the Defence Minister's Trophy for the highest marks in the 10th rank class.

Principal's Annual Report

2015-2016

Honourable Chief Guest of the evening Shri V S Sankh, IAS, distinguished guests, esteemed parents, members of the staff and my dear cadets, Good Evening to you all and a warm welcome once again.

The chief guest has been adequately introduced to the audience by our Administrative Officer and as I do not wish to duplicate the same. Suffice to say, we are indeed fortunate and honoured to have such an illustrious officer like his good self as the Chief Guest for the 54th Annual Day 2015. Sir, I am sure that your benign presence on this occasion will be a great source of motivation for all of us.

On this befitting occasion I shall now present before you the wide spectrum of activities and events carried out in the School during the latest academic session 2015-16.

Nerva School Kashiabazaar is one of the 20 Sansik Schools in the country, which was established in 1962. It has come a long way since its inception in making a significant mark as an educational institution of high repute aimed at overall development of students with a military bias in our beloved state of Kerala.

Apart from our basic aim of preparing the boys for entry into the National Defence Academy/ Naval Academy and the OTA, the training imparted in this school shapes the students socially and creates in them a firm base to approach life meaningfully in order to emerge as responsible citizens of India and leaders in different walks of life.

New Admissions

After the All India Sansik Schools Entrance Examination and selection procedure (Invitation), 181 cadets were admitted to the school in the beginning of the current session, 100 in Class VI and 80 in Class IX. The present school strength includes 620 Boarders and 34 Day Scholars.

Academics

Despite a very busy schedule of various regular co-curricular and extra-curricular activities, Academics continue to be one of our prime concerns. As in the past, this year too our academic achievements have been good with 100% pass in Class X and class XII CBSE Board Exams held in March 2016. Of the 97 cadets who appeared in class X, 06 cadets secured 10 CGPA, 77 cadets secured above 7.5 CGPA and the remaining 14 cadets secured CGPA 6 to 7.4. 04 cadets were awarded merit certificates by CBSE for securing A1 for all subjects. The overall CGPA was 8.03.

In class XII, of the 85 cadets who ap-

peared, 30 secured distinctions and the remaining 55 secured first divisions. The top scorers in class XII among all Sansik Schools, OJ Akash M Lal and Cibi Mathadev A, who secured 95% marks from this school.

Cadet Nitish JM received CBSE merit card.

I wish to place on record the excellent work done by the Vice Principal, Lt Col Girish Gopalan, Senior Master Mr K Harisharan and his team of teachers in bringing up the results to this enviable standard.

Sir, you will appreciate it more when we convey to you that this result is a product of purely classroom education and not based on any sort of extra tuitions.

Sports and Games

Facilities for playing almost all major games (Basketball, Hockey, Volleyball, Tennis, Badminton, Cricket and Badminton) and participation in athletic track and field events exist in the School campus. Besides these, the Cadets take up indoor games like Table Tennis, Chess and Carrom. Participation in motor sports for all the boys

is compulsory and one hour in the evening in the daily routine has been earmarked for this purpose. The School has a modern swimming pool of Olympic standards and the curriculum has inbuilt a programmed Swimming Class for each cadet from class VII to XII. Cadets are also engaged in multi-talented hobby activities including Karate, Kungfu and Yoga.

South Zone Sports and Cultural Meet

The South Zone Sansik Schools Games Meet 2015 was conducted at Sansik School Kashiabazaar from 20 Jul 15 to 25 Jul 15. 340 cadets from South Zone schools participated in the Sports, Co-curricular & Cultural Meet. Brig Bharat Balakrishna, Brigade Commander of 1st Brig declared the meet open.

This School emerged the overall under-16 group champion with 43 points and won Basketball, Junior Football and Debate competitions. Shri M Suresh Kumar IAS, Secretary Power and Sports, Chairman and MG Kerala State Electricity Board granted the possession of the closing ceremony in the





Chief Guest and given away the prizes to the winners.

A team of 16 cadets from school Junior Football team participated in the Inter Zonal Football championship for juniors held from 08 to 06 Aug 2021 at Sainik School Gopalganj. A team of 12 cadets of the School Basketball team participated in the All India Sainik Schools Inter School Basketball Championship held from 14 to 16 Oct 2021 at Sainik School Hapur.

The seventh edition of the Capt R Harbison, Ashok Chakravarti Memorial All Kerala Inter School Basketball tournament sponsored by Old Boys Association (OBA) of the school concluded at Sainik School Kozhikode on 20 Oct 2021. Eight teams from various schools participated. Father Dennis Paul, Principal, Sainik School, Thiruvananthapuram, granted the function as Chief Guest and gave away the trophies and medals to the winners. Our school bagged the runners up trophy whereas Sainik School IITM was the winner's trophy.

National Defence Academy

Our first batch of students joined NDA in 1951 and till date, more than 160 alumni have been awarded the President's Commission in the Armed Forces. Quite a few of them have been conferred gallantry awards for their services and sacrifices rendered to the nation. Regular NDA preparatory classes are arranged for the boys to prepare them for the UPSC written examination.

88 Cadets appeared in the UPSC Exam for IIA & IIS NDA Courses, 27 cadets qualified the exam and 18 cadets qualified IIS whereas 06 cadets joined NDA/Naval Academy. The UPSC written examination for entry into the IIA NDA course was held on 27 Sep 2021. 09 cadets of Class XI appeared in the examination. Results are awaited.

Presentations/Talks

A talk cum presentation on the Thiruvananthapuram and Andaman & Nicobar Island was conducted on 27 Aug 2021 by Air Commodore P Singh.

A Talk cum Presentation on the subject 'Child Rights, Abuse and Child Protection Law' was conducted by me on 07 Nov 2021 at 1000 at this very name Auditorium. All staff members including teachers from Sainik IPS also attended.

- 17 Work done/ being done from Mess Green.
- 18 Construction of new NDA block.
- 19 Change of two roofs and two towers of academic block.

Total Level Survey

Site survey of the entire land pertaining to the school using total station survey was conducted by a team of surveyors deputed by the PWD Kerala. The long pending issue that was finally resolved and the school now is a step closer to the Memorandum of Association being signed with the state Govt.

Audit

The story of Gandhari had always intrigued me. As a young lady, just over the writing age, I used to wonder how someone could manage a brood of 100 children. As my girls grew to think about 10% of the brood were within a 100 days of each other, 20% would be crying, 30% adamant and the whole lot quarrelling in all senses. Gandhari would have had all the comforts of a palace and no staff - but for a common woman, bringing up 100 children would be a real challenge if the strength exceeds a size of two. But Gandhari made me see my mother in a different light altogether along with my other aunts and grandmothers. Yes, her life, nothing more than that, as her life. I decided quite early in life I should not think what would have been the normal story of Gandhari had she been a common woman, what with the class X and XII results and entrance and whatnot. I never knew that I would marry a Kashi and that Kashi would end up moving from being a teacher to the educational officer of the Army and finally head up as the Principal of his own Army. Main only to find he was a much larger brood of children than what Gandhari used to manage. Well,

Well, while in Delhi, what he used to do I asked friends to take it through whatever they happened to hear about, someone and I got some back asking whether we were about to announce our marriage. He replied in the affirmative, saying no one. But that was not what I was looking for. Though I read there to and fro through the WhatsApp group, as all prior and proper were done with their families' groups and messages, it didn't strike me as anything more than a chance of a meeting between friends. That he meant business, I realised after about 10 months of our stay at 'The Kashi House', the apartment house at Delhi.

The new class VI had joined school in June. Most of the talk at home that revolved around their attire, smart and, however, overall. The highlight being we smart also desiring to be 'Principal' that he would cry only for 'three days' and then stop 'hoping to become the principal of the school one day' as he was told that their previous 'Principal' had done just 'that' 30 years ago. I was proud of the selection system that brought them to us when I witnessed most of them performing seamlessly on the Fresher's day conducted within two weeks of their joining. The year when I first met them and then on, sporadic visits to their houses during study hours brought me closer to them. Over time, I was in realisation when our family, all full-time home stay girls, called to discuss a meeting amongst ourselves. Though my husband was on leave, he immediately left for office and without realising what I was upto, my husband carried me to the Pigeon room. I think that was when the reality of how seriously our responsibilities were to me for the first time. After three hours, I went once again to the Pigeon room to check all my duties, even by then, the real world wasn't all what it could be for the child who was taking in the factors into the picture, unaided by a lot of an upbringing, most notably a parent.

It then became a routine affair, my special visits to the girls rooms, though I usually, am for receive shared welfare. Class XII morning for four days (DSC) within, external programme of that class, Smart week for class X, where I tried my level best to drive respect into the head of my children, husband to let the school have stellar boards and an external visit, of course, he didn't budge. Keeping my reasons to be almost as per my child, my daughter, and over the years going at 100%, Board exams of class XII and so on. The long-term focus of my father-in-law's culture just before the debarment of each result of the above, in itself was a driving force to the level these children had been exhibiting. As the girls' presence of success, well, words fail me. It was such a happy thing, hearing the wonderful results these girls delivered despite being away from their father's love, clocked by children outside for academics. I have no reason to disagree, when my husband

attempts this experience, as even to all round development, surely these children are not left low. It goes on to say that they were called by the parents to share a specially composed award to mark their fathering about the amount of actual growth happening in a child. None of the great necessity, Sir VK Krishna Murthy, who conceived the scheme to be running in our environment and to reward whomever the Alims are founding wherever they are.

Even were all the ladies who were residents of the Zakat house before we would have gone through the trials, tribulations, joys and of course, happiness of being a mother to this large brood. I have heard them when before that their memories when you are usually taken by surprise by these little ones. Well, I knew when a girl of 17 class XII kept came home unaccompanied in April this year to wish us all on 'Vidya' Spring Veda, I had prepared a little Pigeon (lovely called Mala Pigeon) by my husband along with a little bouquet. The Principal asked them to come and see mine and after the initial presentation, we smart also has been here (and) proclaimed for

affairs towards the inauguration of the school to them that is how that of my house being tried in glory. Mad, I would not want to share whatever little was made with all of them and they solemnly gave me a beautiful 'Dussehra' banner, by stating that it was the best Pigeon they ever had. The morning this I walked around with a feeling of a special visitor who had a chance of making her children happy. Well, an another year down, the cycle was repeated. Already the year's Dussehra day is over and done with. Bearing him, but all hopeful expectations, absorbing the ambience of this wonderful act of learning, yet in transferring their work, ability and obedience to the campus to keep it ever young! What a beautiful, never ending cycle. It is reminded of an all evergreen English movie, 'The never ending story'.

So, dear ones, please would ever stop as ever as mothers like me who nurture a large brood, be seen in the things that are so important enough. There you see you're back on the little life in a school like this.

A Dream Journey

The visits to historical places, dams, lakes, waterfalls, shopping, the SriLankans never made us feel bored.

The year of October 2013 was perhaps one of the most exciting days in my life. It started this day that I was to start my journey in Sri Lanka as part of the Youth Exchange Programme of NCC. 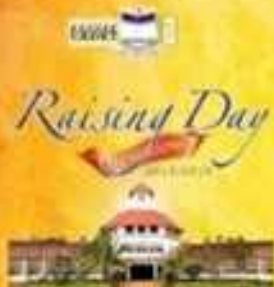

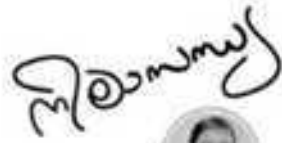

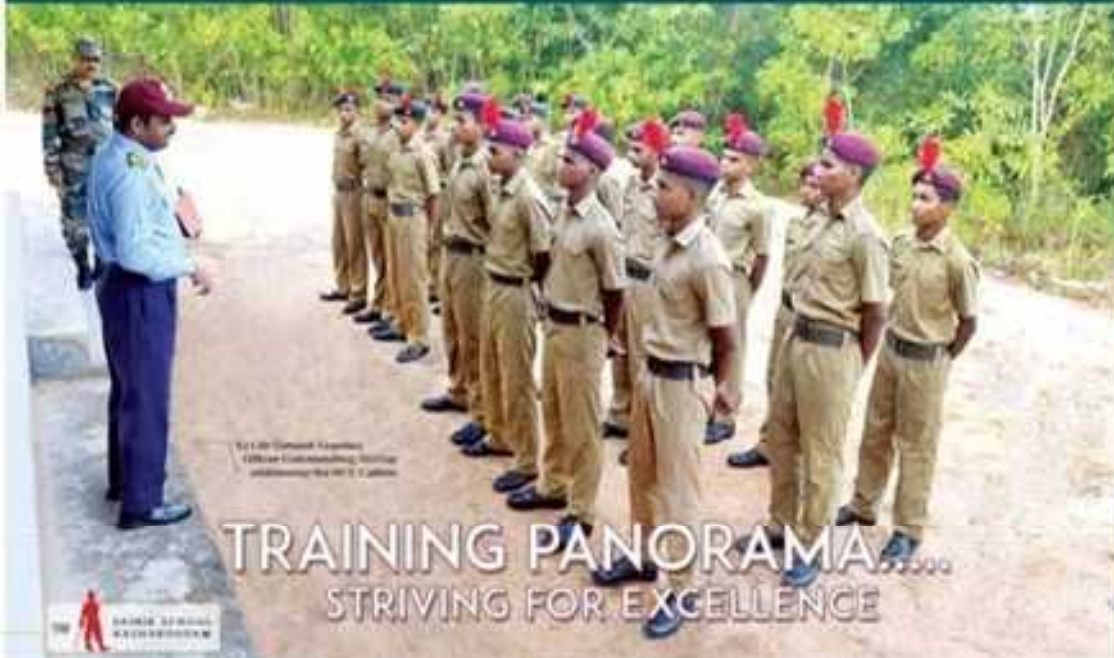
