Principal's Annual Report

2016/2017

The chief guest has been adequately impressed to our audience by our Admin Officer and to I take the wish to duplicate the same. Suffice to say, we are indeed fortunate and honoured to have such an illustrious officer like your goodself as the Chief Guest for the 5th Annual Day 2016 being celebrated in conjunction with the 50th Baising Day. So, I am sure that your benign presence on this occasion will be a great source of motivation for all of us.

On this forthcoming occasion I shall now present before you the wide spectrum of activities and events carried

out in the School during the current academic session 2016/17.

Sanskrit School Kachalavaram is one of the 25 Sanskrit Schools in the country, which was established in 1962. It has come a long way since its inception in making a significant mark as an educational institution of high repute aimed at overall development of students with a military bias in our beloved state of Kerala.

Apart from our basic aim of preparing the boys for entry into the National Defence Academy/ Naval Academy and the OTA, the strategy adopted in this school shapes the students socially and trains them a better how to approach life meaningfully in order to emerge as responsible citizens of India and leaders in different walks of life.

New Admissions: After the All India Sanskrit Schools Entrance Examination, and selection procedure shortlisted, 129 cadets were admitted to the school in the beginning of the current session, 113 in Class VI and 16 in Class IX. The present school strength is now including 629 Boarders and 17 Day Scholars.

A Founder's party was organised for the new entrants on 10th Jun 16.

A significant point in this regard is the entry of tribal children from the most backward areas of Anapatti, making it to the folds of this people's public school. Thus, for the first time, the ST quota is getting fully subscribed by the most deserving.



In-service Training for School Teachers: An in-service training programme/ Teachers Workshop for teachers was conducted at Sanskrit School Bignur, Kanyakumari from 02 to 07 May 2016. Four teachers, Mr Alex Abraham, Asst Master English, Mr Arun Kumar MS, Master Chemistry, Mr Justice KJ, Asst Master Social Science and Mr Manoj M, Asst Master Mathematics attended and successfully completed the workshop programme.

Academics: Despite a very busy schedule of various regular co-curricular and extra-curricular activities, academics continue to be one of our prime concerns. As in the past, this year too our academic achievements have been good with 100% pass in Classes X and class XII CBSE Board Exams held in March 2017. Of the 113 cadets who appeared in class X, 98 cadets secured 10 CGPA, 48 cadets secured CGPA above 9, 30 cadets secured CGPA above 8 and the remaining 07 cadets secured CGPA above 7.8. Merit certificates were awarded to 28 cadets by CBSE for scoring A1 for all subjects. The overall CGPA was 8.18.

In class XII, the school topped literacy by becoming the topper among all Sanskrit Schools. This year all 07 cadets who appeared, obtained first class with 62.0% being the lowest score, 67% of students scored distinction and 17% secured above 90%. This year's school topper was Gokul Shree KS and Gokul Hari Shankar, who secured 97%.

Trust is acknowledging the excellent work done by the erstwhile Vice Principal, Gb Genuki Gopalan, Senior Master Mr K Rajendran and his team of teachers in bring up the results to this exciting standards and in the same time culture the new Vice Principal, Lt Gb Prithvijay Kulkarni to continue the efforts. So, you will appreciate to note when we convey to you that this result is a product of pure classroom education and not based on extra-curricular.

National Defence Academy: Our first batch of students joined NDA in 1967 and till date, about 1000 alumni have been awarded President's Commissions in the Armed Forces or is close to acquiring the same. Some of them have been conferred gallantry awards for the services and sacrifices rendered to the nation. Regular NDA preparatory classes are arranged for the boys to prepare them for the UPSC written examination.

69 Cadets appeared in the UPSC Exam for 136 & 137 NDA Gurus, 21 cadets qualified the exam and 07 cadets qualified GSE out of which all 06 cadets joined NDA Naval Academy. Presentations / Talks: A Talk cum Presentation on the subject Career Prospects in Indian Navy and Merchant Navy was conducted by Cdr R. Nishant (Retd) on 24 Oct 2016 at 1300H.

A series of lectures on career options were given as part of Project Ten Ganga Series by the 01 Batch alumni.

Dr Paul Marikar delivered a talk cum presentation on the subject 'Life Style Diseases and youth' on 11 Jun 16. This programme was organised by one of our old boy [Roll No. 9277 77 InscM] Prof (Dr) AE Shrinani.

Gd M Nair AC KC Memorial Quiz: The 67 edition of Gd M Nair AC, KC Memorial Inter School Quiz Competition was held in this very institution on 28 Oct 16. More than 10 leading schools participated in this prestigious competition in which our school secured the runners up trophy whereas Arya Great School Thiruvananthapuram emerged as winners. Mr Prens C Nair, former teacher of SSCOM and a leading language trainer of Technopark granted the occasion as chief guest and gave away the prizes to the winners.

Tiranga Yatra: To commemorate the 70th Independence Day and the valiant soldiers proceeding to the border, a Tiranga yatra was organised in collaboration with IAF. A grand function was organised in the school campus to flag off the Tiranga Yatra. The yatra was flagged off by none other than the Hon'ble Governor of Kerala Justice (Retd) P Sathyanarayana on 23 Aug 16. The yatra was led by Arjuna Avasthi (Dpt) and B. Laksh.

Book Release: A biography on the life of Roll No. 1122 (Last) Pte Officer MP Avil Kumar winner of Air Cade Nishu Saha, ACC, T AUSA was released in a grand function organised in the school, under the aegis of Southern Air Command Alambur on 08 Nov 16. Air Marshal S Nishikumar, YSM, VM, ACC in C & Chairman IBA SSCOM granted the occasion as the Chief Guest and released the book in South India.



Sports and Games: Facilities for playing almost all major games (Cricket, Hockey, Volleyball, Tennis, Basketball, Badminton and Table Tennis) and option to participate in indoor track and field events as well as being given in the School campus. Besides these, the Cadets take up indoor games like Table Tennis, Chess and Carrom. Participation in the games for all the boys is compulsory and one hour in the evening is the daily routine has been earmarked for this purpose. The School has a modern swimming pool of Olympic Standard and all the curriculum has the facility of a programmed Swimming Class for each cadet from VI to XII. One class per year is identified to be provided with extensive coaching in swimming. We have awarded to class VII C this year and cadets are also engaged in multifarious hobby activities like Karate and Yoga.

State Zone Sports and Cultural Meet: The State Zone Inter School Sports Games Meet 2016 was conducted at Sairik School Kozhikode from 20 Jul 16 to 25 Jul 16 for a consecutive record time. 150 cadets from many more schools participated in the Sports & Cultural Meet. Air Vice Marshal G Anur Prasad Babu, VM, SCA, SAC, Alambur declared the meet open.

Our School emerged as the overall champion

with 15 years winning Basketball, Junior Football and Carrom events. Dakshin & Quilchampionship, Hurtle Education Mission, Prof G Rameshbabu granted the occasion of closing ceremony in the chief guest and gave away the prizes to winners.

A team of 16 cadets from school Junior Football team participated in their Zonal Football Championship for juniors held from 01 to 06 Aug 2016 at Sairik School Bese, MP A team of 12 cadets of school Basketball team participated. All India Sairik School Inter Basketball championship held from 01 to 06 Oct 2016 at Sairik School Bagepuzha.

Audit: The Local Audit Officer from IAO Ponnale and the school's own audit committee met in this academic year. No serious audit objections were reported.

Financial Status: The school is facing some financial crisis with a glaring gap between the expenditure and income for the FY 2016-17 (Rs. 36,17,54,448) and expenditure for the FY 2016-17 (Rs. 36,17,54,448). The yearly loss was less than Rs. 10,00,000/- and had no far-reaching impact. However, the salary and pension arrears

accumulated in the last four years due to the 47 pay commission. This case was proposed from TDA to State as well as Central Ministry and was also a major point in the last Directorate conference. As a result of this, an order was released by the State Government, Ministry of Defence to increase the salary for from Rs. 34,330/- to Rs. 34,330/- and an addition of 30% of subsequent years. The proposals are also on the way from the school administration as take over the deficit and has been agreed in principle.

Admission: School administration draws much importance towards providing the best infrastructural facilities to the cadets as well as staff. Under Action Plan with PWD, a number of works were initiated/ ongoing/ completed. Some of them are:-

Augmentation of two roads and two covers of academic block (using MoEF fund). Construction of NDA Block (using MoEF fund). Construction of Mountain Training shed covering one Basketball and one Volleyball court. Re-construction of sewage lines and manholes for staff quarters. Construction of one new dormitory which can accommodate 120 cadets - construction is in progress. Mess

The school now holds an ISO9001 license since 2014. Considerable effort is being concentrated towards maintenance and upkeep of the Mess. As he has been doing research the same in the same year. A heavy duty water filter had been installed which now provides filtered water for cooking & drinking purposes. The former cooking plant has been replaced which has resulted in considerable saving on cooking gas expenditure. With the help of PWT, Kerala, other civil & electrical works are regularly carried out to maintain the requisite standards. Other ongoing maintenance and upgrading works are expected to be carried out before the start of the next academic session. Despite the severe financial crunch being faced, efforts are on from the administration side to ensure the use of cadet's by the cadets and dining to members which would add another milestone in the growing aspect.

The catering expenditures are more on the rise which forced the school administration to approach the State Govt to increase the subsidy charges at Rs. 60/- per day per cadet, which facilitated achieving a fine balance on the expenditure on catering. However the increase got nullified when as a belt from the State, the state civil supplies departments were forced to discontinue the APS ration, which was being provided till recently. This alone has resulted in an increase in expenditures of Rs. 13 Lakhs per year on procurement of Rice, which is the staple diet.

Disaster Plans: Disaster Plans for the academic session 2017-18 was held in a successful manner on 13th of this month. As many as 1500 students attend their back at 5 centres across Kerala including the newly started centre at Palakkad and in other centres all over the country. The results are expected to be announced on 30th of July 2017.

SRI N BALAKRISHNAN NAIR

I'm unable to write a single word. However, the predicament does not destabilise me, for I know for sure that anyone in my position would feel the same helplessness. I had taken on the responsibility of getting a few words on one of the legends who walked the green soil of our alma mater, Sri N Balakrishnan Nair Sir. Having volunteered to do this, I really am in a bind as to how to proceed. My worry, would my words be even remotely befitting this great Master? I hope to do so.

There are times when you think your words for having taken a decision. One time was such whenever I decided to name my step-son for ascending the Principals Conference through Bangalore. My mission, to spend some time with a teacher, a great man to God, my NBN Sir. I was quite reluctant to go empty handed to meet him and so ring up his son, Sri Pradeep for advice as to what would make him happy. The response was exactly my expected lines. He advised me against any such attachments, but asked me to be prepared to spend at least half an hour with him, for that's all that he desired from his cadets. Since I was unable to accept the first part of his advice, I spent some time contemplating as to what could be taken without offending the Teacher. Late one night before my travel, he took me. I hurriedly got up, searched for the note and located a piece of air and started making a pencil sketch of him. Once finished, I silently thanked God Almighty for giving me the idea and my art teacher, Sri Sri Sri Rao for giving me the wherewithal to execute it.

When I reached his house, he was waiting for me, having been informed by Prakash sir. I was usually taken aback by the skinny and puny figure who greeted me. I was almost five years older than him then and it seemed the passing of Muzum had had a telling effect on his health. He was visibly happy to be going to school for the first time in his life. He made me sit and covered himself to go toward his younger brother who was bedridden and a patient of dementia. Once again his presence was accompanied by his act of adopting his brother, a teacher, and providing him everything possible. As he wanted to go with Muzum and his own railway uncle, I presented him the parents with much conviction. To avoid a situation, I had no girl strapped up and whatever resistance that would Per come up to him seemed to melt away as he glared at the parents. I hardly remember that it was decided by me and not his own glances and moans over. He hugged the parents and cried which made me break down too. He said 'Sir, this is a great gift for an old man so receive'. Since the time I reached his house, he had addressed me as 'sir' which very evidently pleased me in a painful situation. (6/2/2011) of 90 days I said, believing him to be mistaking me for someone else. I knew he said 'Sir' now you are the Principal of my school. I should not give the status of Gods for addressing the head of my institution which gave me everything in life by his first name'. For the first time, I heard the praising order which miraculously brought me back to my alma mater to serve him. This Sir, I am what I am because of the very same alma mater and a set of beautiful teachers like you, Sir is Disappointment for a teacher to address his students thus? My legs didn't seem to run any ground. That's NIN sir, if he is concerned of something, he wouldn't be, come hell or high water Sir, Dr APJ Abdul Kalam was also caught by many teachers. He became the President of India. Do you want to say that his teachers should call him by name and take similar liberties? I didn't have an answer. However, seeing my terrible predicament and in my total relief for the rest of our meeting, he instructed without addressing me.

He spoke at length about the initial days of our school and how he came into to be a teacher here.

It seems that he was a research fellow in Bombay, when he was among a few to be handicapped by an per fit, the infectious disease of some, the then Dalmeida Mission, Sirs VIKK Mission. He reached Delhi as ordered and moved to the Dalmeida



Mission's office. There were a few others and he was seen in by the DA in his care. He was asked by the RM to immediately move to Patiyode so which he conveyed his inability due to his research fellowship. Next accident word was spoken and he was sent out. Once outside, he was spotted by the Kerala DA as so when interrogated and hearing his response, the good old man appeared shell shocked and advised him to move back immediately to the RM and apologize and accept the offer. A terrified NIN sir moved back in and somehow conveyed his apology and acceptance whereas, the RM just grinned, nodded and saw a piece of paper on which he was scribbling something. He gave the note sheet to him and asked him to give a note to the DA. The DA took one look at the sheet and looked at me as if it was a letter to his brother. I hesitated to cancel his fellowship.

Mrs Prakash brought in tea and snacks in the very same time every classroom, till November 2012, Gopi joined us. The conversation then revolved around very merry service CEOs, their families and

problems etc. Sir brought out old albums and all those of us were immersed in nostalgia all it was similar Gopi to him for his office. Once Gopi left, Sir was positive for a while, as if finalizing and securing certain thoughts in his mind. When he spoke, his words were clear. He said that he was waiting for an opportunity to disclose certain things for long and was happy that he could do so to someone who is in a position as the alma mater. He mentioned a particular Master, again a legend in his own way and about their strained relations based on some misunderstanding that the other mattered. He said that he always considered that master as his own brother and would remain indebted to him for ever for the kindness shown to him during the delivery of his son as well as during a serious medical episode of his wife. On both occasions, the master and his lady had gone out of the way to look after him and take care of his family's needs. He recalled how his family was looked after by another one by that good soul when he was refused to be absorbed from a school day by the then Principal which motivated him to be away for a long period of time. It was a time of extreme strain since his wife was not keeping so well. One or some silly misunderstandings, the relation strained and he could never clear these misconceptions till date. He cried again saying that it was the biggest mistake in his life for not clearing the air when he could while in school. I consider myself as lacking in the ability to effectively console someone in mental pain and hence was not much for words. However, he recovered immediately and asked me to sit near him and show and explain the school magazine that I had carried with me so hand over. He received a keen interest in the happenings of the school which were reflected in the magazine and paper with child like wonder as the administrative developments. Once done, he again moved into his brotherly room to look after him and after some time called me inside. He had opened a wall diary wherein he had scrawled hand made albums and gift boxes, a wide time pass and a medal to keep his brain active as per him. He invited I pick up my own memories too just for me, for my wife and children too. The two boxes,

one big and one small, will adorn my house in precious gifts.

I was always lunch time and I had a state to catch. I had already spend about five hours with Sir. Though he insisted that I should leave lunch, I remained myself and took his leave. His parting words will ring in my ears 'I might not be able to see you in our school again. I am not bothered about parting up. I actually passed away when I retired from my home of 50 years. My soul remained there as I moved on. It will remain there. It will always remain there. Do whatever you feel best for the school. Our blessings will be there with you'.

I was in school as a class XII student when Sir retired from service in Oct 1989. He continued to stay on in campus, paying me for his accommodation from his pension and use our lunch through our board room. Dedication unfathomable was what all of us perceived it as often. With his parting words, another strongman emerges.
