Principal's Report 2017/2018

It's indeed a singular honour for me to be here to present the annual report of the school to such an exalted audience whose collective value has been exponentially increased by the presence of none other than our honourable Presiding Officers. They have been adequately introduced to the audience in the morning and I do not wish to duplicate the same. Let me now embark on the onerous task of presenting my report.

Sainik School Karkhalsitam is one of the 26 Sainik Schools in the country which was established in 1962. Apart from our principal aim of preparing the boys for entry into the job commission training academies, the training imparted in this school shapes the students socially and equips them a know-how to approach life successfully in order to emerge as responsible citizens of India and leaders in different walks of life.



New Admissions

After the All India Sainik Schools Entrance Examination this January and selection procedure thereafter, 100 cadets were admitted to the school 50 in Class V and 50 in Class VI. The primary school strength is now including 625 Academics and 61 Day Scholars. I'm happy to announce that the second set of 4 cadets have joined us from Anupada through Project Shree. It is with pride that

I mention that all of them have adjusted very well to our campus. Out of the seven children who joined last year, six have been promoted on their own, while whom one has been detained in class as based on parent's request. The number of applications being received have shows a steady rise, thanks to our combined on propagation of our cause.

Training

In the arena of academics, we came first among all Sainik Schools in the country in the year 2016 in the class 10 results. However, this year we came a close second to St. Konradia by a sheer margin of 18.4 with a place on record the excellent work done by the Vice Principal, Lt Col Prashant Kalia, Senior Master Anil K Rajendran and his team of teachers to bring up the results to the enviable standard. It may be appreciated that this result is a product of pure classroom education and not based on any sort of extra tuition. The class 8 results were a bit discouraging with 3 comparisons in A+B category. All the three shared the comparisons and are in 30 now. These three boys were a part of 11 who were recommended to be admitted on grounds of low academic performance in their class 8 exams. It was a challenge taken by us to keep all 11 with us and give special attention. One

wondered whether to take credit for bringing eight out of them to the other side of the fence in the first go or accept blame for spoiling a core generic score of the school in class 8 due to the remaining three who have cleared.

For lowering the approach towards academics, extra classes for weak students are organized daily. The overall failures in various classes have much reduced and the fall curve now shows a forward thrust. The number of casual tests have been increased. The system of evening study period have also been changed and it now happens in houses under the direct supervision of a monitor. The connecting wire to and to the academic block has been thus gained.

The graph of withdrawal have also seen a healthy decline. The students due to academic under performance has reduced by the grace of God, there has not been any case of absconding from the school.

Parent-Teacher Meeting

The Parent teacher meet which was a trend in a year after has been increased to three in 2017. 36 and now to four in a year. P.T.M was held for Junior & Senior classes separately on 25 & 27 Aug, 24 & 21 Oct and

together on 25 Nov 17. A large number of parents attended the meeting and interacted with members of the faculty. The P.T.M for third session is slated for 30 Feb 18.



In-service Training for Sainik School Teachers

An in-service training programme for Mathematics, English and Social Science teachers was conducted at Sainik School Panaji, Vem Bungal from 05 to 09 Jan 2017. These teachers, Mr Mathew CC, Anil Man-

oj Social Science, Smt Soma B, Anil Manoj English and Smt CK Saptree Raj, Manoj in Mathematics attended and successfully completed the training programme.



Sports and Games

Facilities for playing almost all major games (Football, Hockey, Volley Ball, Tennis, Basketball, Cricket and Badminton) and participation in athletic track and field events are in the school campus. In the charge of every cadet has been reserved only for Sundays which assures that all cadets play contact and Intra games on all other days. Besides these, the Cadets take up indoor games like

Table Tennis, Chess and Carrom. Participation in major sports for all the boys is compulsory and one hour in the evening to the daily routine has been reserved for this purpose. The school has a modern swimming pool of Olympic Standards and the centre also has an indoor Swimming Club for each cadet from VI to XII in the non-contact hours. Cadets are also exposed to rebellious hobby activities

like the Karate, Judo and Yoga. The ragging academies were also witnessed a sort of renaissance with regard to the lesser sports. When I took over, the school had a low bar structure with holding boxes for all 100, 7 & 4 in sub junior, 9 & 10 in junior and 11 & 12 in senior. That was immediately changed to 6 & 7 in sub junior, 8, 9 & 10 in junior and 11 & 12 in senior as a first step towards

bringing back the old house system of 4 units, a different junior and 3 sub junior houses. The year that has been achieved by adding class X also to senior houses. The present house system has been visited by the USA, so that it is no more subjected to frequent changes.

Co-curricular Activities

To bring both the better cadets in the Cadets, Inter House Competitions were held in oratorical, Declaration, Q&A, Essay Writing, Calligraphy, Debate and Extempore Competition. While exposure is also given to the cadets by allow-

ing them to participate in various literary competitions conducted by leading schools in and around Thiruvananthapuram. An area of concern was brought forth by a house Captain in 2011 who came on stage to deliver a per-

formed speech and could not do so due to stage light. This led to the understanding that more than half of the school does not get a chance on stage to face an audience. Participation in all literary competitions were miraculously disabled and now each house is represented by 4 speakers for each event. The number of events permissible for a cadet has been reduced to two which means that different cadets are called by the houses and more cadets get to take the podium. Now class of students now engage in a group discussion on stage during the Principals assembly on all Mondays. A time period of 30 minutes has been incorporated in the time table on all non assembly days, wherein the concerned class teachers get 2 to 3 cadets to speak

in the class. The system of public speaking during the house roll calls are also seeing good results. The house master now opine that there is a healthy competition within the house during auditions for various events with more and more cadets coming up.

Annual Athletic Meet

We conducted our 56th annual Athletic Meet from 22 Oct 2017 to 23 Oct 2017. Apara Award winner, Sena Padman Thomas an International athlete and former president of Kerala Sports Council was granted the occasion as Chief Guest for the final and gave away the prizes.

National Defence Academy

Our best batch of students joined NDA in 1988 and till date, more than 1000 cadets have been awarded the President's Commendation in the Armed Forces. Quite a few of them have been conferred gallantry awards for their services and sacrifices rendered in the nation. Very many of them reached the higher echelons of the defence forces. Regular NDA preparatory classes are arranged for the boys to prepare them for the UPSC written exam session.

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62 Cadets appeared to the UPSC Exam for IAS & IAS NDA Courses. 16 cadets qualified the exam and 10 cadets qualified IAS, whereas 10 cadets joined NDA based Academy and CRA Camps. The UPSC written examination for entry into the IAS NDA course was held on 10 Sep 2015. 84 cadets of Class 10 appeared in the examination. We passed the exam and are awaiting their call letters.

Speaking of NDA results, our school had won DM trophy 3 times. First in 1988 and then in '75, '76 and '88. The maximum entry percentage was over 40% in 1974 and lowest in '86, 2007 and 2010. The consolidated

Administration

The steering wheel of the Administration has to solid hands entrusted by the fact that the Administrative Officer is an old boy. I must compliment Col & Comd Kumar and his team for ensuring a seamless and smooth administrative setup for the school. Considerable delay had occurred

SAINIK SCHOOL NCC & ME A NOSTALGIC TRIP

While studying in Sainik School, NCC was compulsory part of the curriculum. Though our normal life and routine were in uniform, we loved the NCC parades because it was different. Two days in a week, instead of normal games, we had to attend NCC parades. Preparing for it by itself was exciting. The uniform had to be set, the brass buttons on the belt and the badge on the knee were to be checked using brush of they shined like gold. The top buttons which had feet and the head to be polished till one could see his reflection in it and also ensure that they had the letter 'N' and 'C' on them clearly under them.

These NCC parades added to our rudimentary knowledge about the armed forces because that was the time we got to see real tanks very closely. They arrived us with lots of machine guns (most of them had the 100-400 rounds) and the army was double the 400 meters we ran in school. At the end of it there were refreshments with tea. We also got a medal (usually the medal of the march) for working well on them and on it.

Sometimes in our night clubs, we were given training in weapon handling which culminated in

being at the target. There was a big adrenaline rush as we were handling weapons and live ammunition for the first time in our life. The excitement was the army band led to give out all music of which I was over our heads because the whole briefing was in Hindi and our understanding of our Kashmiri was very low. Anyway, remembering that whenever we would see ourselves, we used to bring before the actual firing, we were made to do so much of physical activities like mudsuty and running around a small field (usually which was 1/2 mile or so) was for warming up and looking up someone, we hardly had any stamina left to hold our breath, take aim and fire. But hey, we did. After firing five rounds from a 27 rifle, we were to have a look at our targets even how many hits we had (I could for me, I had three hits on the target, but my neighbour had none. He looked dejected but then on the target next to him, there were seven hits. It was obvious that he had taken aim and fired on the wrong target. He got a nice firing from our instructor for it.

The name of our NCC training was when we were in our tenth class, five of us from our class were selected to participate in the Republic Day Parade at New Delhi. Three of us - (Karthi - 9th, Sunil - 10th & self - 10th) represented the state and two (Sathish - 9th & Sathish - 10th) represented Sainik School. It was for the first time that a Sainik School contingent marching on the Rajpath. The year was 1977 and what a great moment it was for us.

Those days when communications and internet were not as developed as they are now. Delhi was 1000 km far away from Newshim. Though two preparatory camps, we were trained and prepared

Marshal of the IAF Arjan Singh

Marshal of the Indian Air Force Arjan Singh, DFC, (16 April 1919 - 16 September 2017) was Chief of the Air Staff from 1964 to 1968. When I read his biography I was so impressed by him that I decided to write an article on him, for his distinguished service during the Indo-Pak War of 1965 he was awarded the Padma Vibhushan and in 1966 he became the first Indian Air Force Officer to be promoted to the rank of Air Chief Marshal. After coming from IAF, he served as a diplomat, politician and advisor to Governments of India on defence matters. In 2002, he became the first IAF Officer to be promoted to the five-star rank as Marshal of the Indian Air Force equivalent to the Army rank of Field Marshal.

He was born on 16 April 1919 in Jullundur, Punjab in what was then British India, into a Sikh family. His father and grandfather were also in the armed forces and Arjan Singh was the fourth generation of his family to join the British Indian armed force. In 1948, Singh was married to Tap Singh, a lady of his own community, the couple had a daughter, Anu and a son, Arvind who is in the USA.

He was educated at Montgomery and later entered into the Royal Indian Air Force. College Cranwell and was commissioned in the Air Force as a pilot.

Arjan Singh led his 7 squadron, of Royal Indian

Air Force into combat during second World War and was awarded Distinguished Flying Cross (DFC) in June 1944. Arjan Singh was Chief of the Air Staff (CAS) and was awarded Padma Vibhushan in 1965. He was just forty five when appointed CAS, he also became the first Chief of Air Staff to be upgraded to the rank of Air Chief Marshal. Arjan Singh took retirement from his service in 1975 at the age of 56y.

In 1975 after his retirement, he was appointed ambassador to Switzerland and Vatican. He was also appointed High Commissioner to Kenya. Later he was the 11. Governor of Delhi and was made Marshal of the Indian Air Force in January 2002. He led an active life even at the age of ninety eight and continued to take tea and play golf twice a week.

Singh suffered a cardiac arrest in early morning of 16 September 2017. He died at 7:47 pm that evening. He was cremated at their square in New Delhi on 18 September with full military honours, including a military fly past by IAF fighter jets and helicopters.

He was an epitome of hard work and devotion to duty. Let's follow his footsteps to take India ahead.

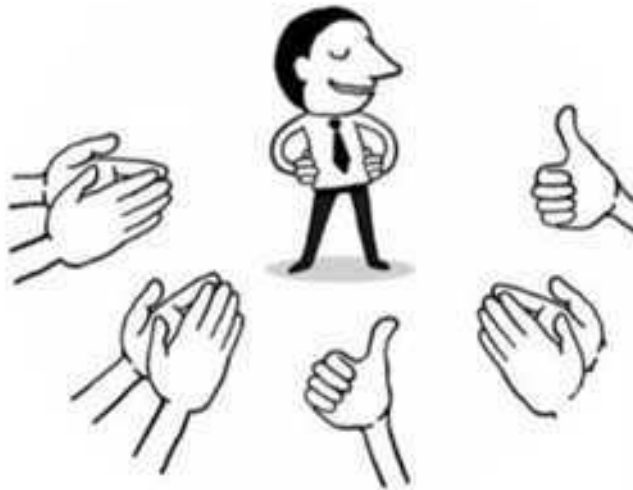

My Experiences at the Officers' Training Academy

It was an unforgettable day in my life, 11/11/2017 the day we the lucky lot of six cadets left for the NCC Officers Training Academy located at Kanpur near Nagpur in Maharashtra for the 10th screening course for ten batches; days of true learning and amazing adventures. The 10th screening course is a course which gives potential NCC Cadets an opportunity to get familiarised with the jeeps of the 10th. I was the junior most of 10th cadets from all over India who attended the camp.

We reached the academy on 12/11/2017 midnight and we were welcomed by the staff with hot meals and later we were taken to our barracks which were very neat and tidy. The next day we had classes on personality development. The classes were taken by Mrs. Swati Naidu a member of the Train Group in Mumbai. It was a very

memorable session as it taught us how to improve our personality and remain positive at all times.

The Course Officer in Charge was Maj Pradham Singh Chaudhary (Shurya Chakra) who was from the 7th Regiment. We were continuously being motivated and encouraged by other officers of the academy who were there along with us during the 10 day long course.

On the first day of the 10th training camp we had the officer's intelligence testing (OIT) test after which we were divided into three groups according to our chess numbers. I still remember my chess number that was no. 36 and I was in group 3. Each group had different tasks. I went for the interview first but could not face the interview as time overtook. The next day I went for the CTD task (Group listing Officer task). The tasks were very

difficult but exciting. Our CTD was Col. Thomas Mathew who was from Kerala. We had the group discussion first and then we had the group task. Our first task was the progressive group task where a group of 10 cadets had to cross certain obstacles with given tasks and then we had the half group task where only half of the groups made to do the task at a time and the last one was the command task. All these tasks equipped us to face the 10th confidently.

We had a number of psychological test which comprised of PPT (Picture perception Test), WAT (Word Association Test), SRT (Situation Reaction Test) and so on. After all these tests, there were few cadets including me who could not attend the interview as there were 10th cadets and each interview took around 30-45 minutes. In those cadets had interviews on the following days. I was lucky to have my interview taken by a Commodore (Equivalent to Brigadier in Army) who gave me a few tips to improve my way of talking and my personality.

In the evening we had lecture classes on current affairs and also we had lectures where we had to speak on a given topic. There were a few cadets who had already attended the 10th but couldn't make it though in their best attempt they too had narrated their experiences at the 10th.

I would like to give a special mention to the camp OC, Maj P2 Chaudhary who had given us lot of information on service subjects as he too was an NCC Cadet and he got into the Army through the NCC special entry. He is a Shurya Chakra awardee for his service in Jammu & Kashmir region. He used to conduct surprise fall ins and gave us long lectures during the night roll call. These were the moments that will reflect about my camp experiences.

We were only six from Kerala and the rest were from other parts of India. We thought that we will have tough time adjusting with them but that

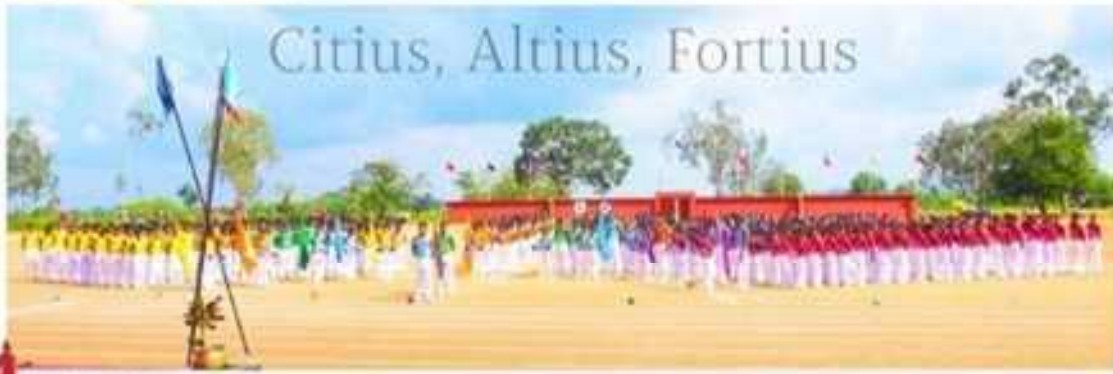
